

USS Toledo (SSN-769)

A Los Angeles class submarine.

Commissioned: February 24th 1995.

Location: Barents Sea, 69 deg 40 min. North, 37 deg 35 min. East. Depth: 350 - 400 feet.

The painting depicts a
Russian Oscar II class
in the process of making
a sudden starboard turn
to clear his baffles....
the so-called "Crazy Ivan"
manoeuvre.
The trailer, USS Toledo,
is depicted at the moment
he has stopped his screw
and gone quiet- in an
attempt to maintain
subterfuge.

The painting was inspired by the rumoured encounter between the Kursk (K-141), USS Toledo and USS Memphis.

The prints are supplied on quality canvas that is laminated with a satin varnish. Ideal size is 1 meter x 60cm.


They are also supplied at **60cm x 37 cm.** They look superb when stretched and framed.


